



Guiding Principles: Safe System Approach

The Safe System Approach is a Paradigm Shift

Traffic deaths are INEVITABLE

PERFECT human behaviour

Prevent COLLISIONS

INDIVIDUAL responsibility

Saving lives is EXPENSIVE

Traffic deaths are PREVENTABLE

Integrate HUMAN FAILING in approach

Prevent FATAL AND SEVERE CRASHES


SYSTEMS approach

- Evaluation






Safety Task Force + Members



Office of Traffic Safety Collision Rankings

When comparing Modesto's traffic safety statistics (collisions) to those of 60 other California cities with similar-sized populations:



Total Fatal and Injury 3rd highest out of 60



Motorcycles 2nd out of 60



Alcohol Involved 4th out of 60



Pedestrians 3rd out of 60



Nighttime (9pm-3am) 1st out of 60






Fatal and Serious Injury Collisions





High Injury Network


75% of fatal and serious injury collisions occur on less than 10% of City roads!





Collision Profiles


- Combination of...
 - Collision factor (e.g., involved party, severity, time of day, cause)
 - Contextual factor (e.g., signals/stop signs, neighborhood type)
- Uncovers systemic patterns for serious collisions
- Informs targeted interventions






Proactive Risk Analysis

- Number of lanes
- Speed limit
- Traffic Volume
- Bikeway class
- Sidewalk status
- Crossing spacing
- Intersection type & traffic signals




